



#### **Ukulele Basics**

#### 1. String names:







The strings are numbered from the string closest to the floor to the string closest your head as you hold the Ukulele - 1 to 4 and named in order A, E, C, G. this can be remembered by the saying:

An Elephant Crushes Gates

string: 1 2 3 4

Some people prefer to remember the string names from the 4<sup>th</sup> to the 1<sup>st</sup> using the saying:


Goats Can Eat Anything

string: 4 3 2 1

If in tune, when you play the strings from the  $4^{th}$  string to the  $1^{st}$  it should have the familiar sound "my dog has fleas"


#### 2. Reading Chord Diagrams


Below are diagrams of ukulele chords. The diagram represents the fretboard of the ukulele, as it would appear standing up in front of you. The numbers next to suggested fingering represent the fingers to be used. A uker's fingers are numbered 1 (index finger) thru 4 (pinky), as shown in the diagram below.

The following chords are common chords used in many ukulele songs. They are the main chords found for songs in the key of C







#### **5. Basic Strum Patterns**

Keep your strumming hand loose and use your wrist rather than your whole arm. If you strum your ukulele too close to the bridge it sounds very tinny (which might be an effect you want sometimes) The 'sweet spot' on a ukulele is usually where the neck hits the body. Most people use their pointy finger to strum. When you strum down, you should be hitting the strings with your nail. When you're strumming up, use the fleshy tip of your finger and keep a regular up/down movement going. But you can use your thumb or all or any of your fingers depending on the sound you want

In some styles you might emphasise certain beats e.g. folk and rock styles sometimes emphasise beats 2 and 4(blowing in the wind; jambalaya; you ain't going nowhere)

There are endless variations on strumming patterns and there are no right or wrong patterns as long as 1: you play in time 2: all players are playing the same pattern

Many variations of the above patterns can be used. Different patterns suit different styles of song.

E.g. New Orleans rhythm (such as for Iko Iko)

Also similar to the "Bo Diddley" rhythm:

(Used in songs like *Willie & the Hand Jive* **Eric Clapton** or *Not Fade Away* by **Buddy Holly** and *Faith* by **George Michael)** 

#### 1. Down Strokes on the beat

Down strokes occur on the beat only

Eg: Row, row, row your boat London's burning

#### 2. Down / up

down stroke on the beat, up strokes on the off beat (+)

Eg: Hes got the whole world Horse with no name Tom Dooley 26 miles If I had a Hammer

#### 3.. Miss the 1st up beat in the bar

Eg: You a'int goin' nowhere

Ukulele bay
Jolene
Daydream

Eg: House of the rising sun Catch the wind Amazing grace

#### 4. Offbeat ( 2 & 4 only)

works with a lot of gospel songs

or emphasise 2 & 4 in down/up rhythm

Eg: jambalaya Brand new key I'll fly away

#### 5. Skip the middle beat

Eg: Stand By Me Jackson Leaving On A Jet Plane Jamaica Farewell

#### 6. Hiccup off beat

Eg: Will The Circle Be Unbroken I'm Walkin' These Boots Are Made For Walkin' Jambalaya

#### 7. Ska / Reggae off beat

1 + 2 + 3 + 4 + - ↑ - ↑ - ↑ - ↑ - U - U - U - U

Eg: Ob La Di Ob La Da Walkin' To New Orleans

#### 8. Shuffle (Swing or Blues)

Down beats held, up beats short

Eg: Lots of Blues Tunes such as Sweet Home Chicago Kansas City Don't You Lie To me

#### 9. Step, Step & Hop

Eg: Chapel Of Love

#### 10. Off Beat with final skip

Eg: Down By The Riverside

#### 11. Combining Rhythms

Many songs or tunes can combine various rhythms to make things more interesting. Sometimes just to spicve up a song as it progresses or to highlight different sections. E.g. one rhythm for the verse another for the chorus.

Some songs you could try this with are: I'm Walkin'; Da Do Ron Ron; Stray Cat Strut; They're Red Hot; Feelin' Groovy; Ain't She Sweet; Bye Bye Love Or any number of others

# RHYTHM IDEAS

Each box represents one beat.

- a. Clap hands to get the rhythm
- b. Play each rhythm on the instrument (the first beat in each box should be a down stroke)
- c. Try to combine two or more of the rhythms one after the other
